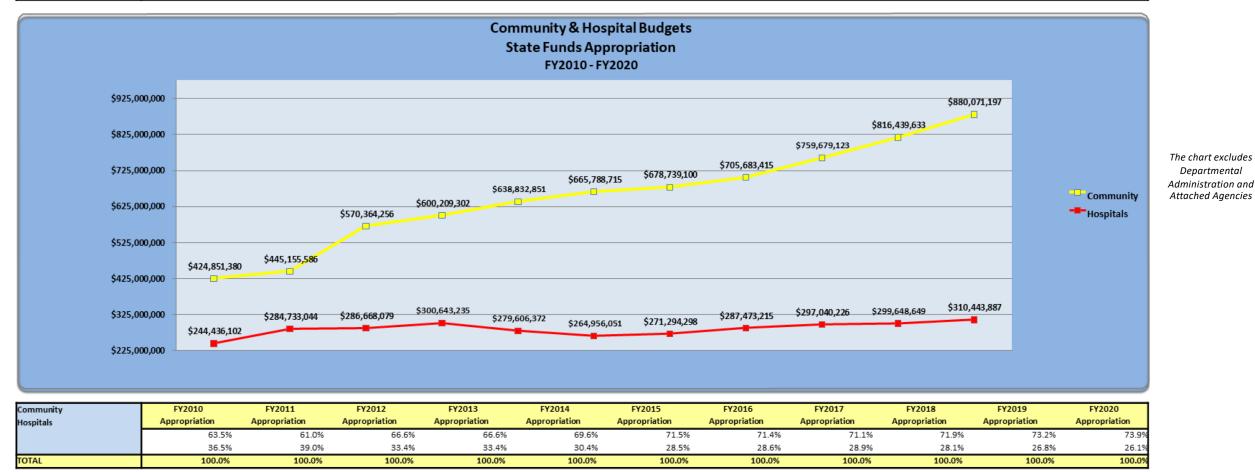

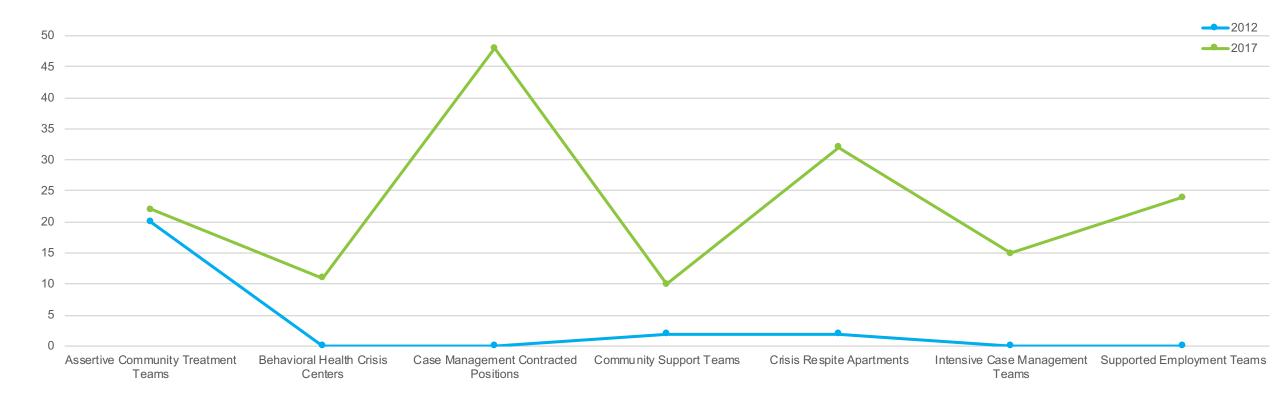

## Community Adult Mental Health Specialty Services

Year 2012: Twenty-four (24) specialty services statewide

Year 2017: One hundred and sixty-two (162) specialty services statewide



The number of adult mental health specialty services\* increased across the state between 2012 and 2017. All regions (Region 1 through Region 6) in the state experienced a dramatic increase in the number of services available. (\* Services: Number of discrete, individual ACT, CST, ICM teams, actual BHCCs; actual individual contracted ADA-CM positions, specific number of CRAs, number of SE teams).

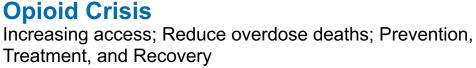

Ensuring viable facilities and workforce; Addressing growing population of individuals involved with court systems



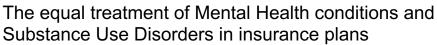
